

<u>Product Care Association</u> Overview of Stewardship Programs for Lighting Products

Regulations in the provinces of British Columbia, Manitoba and Quebec require "product stewardship" programs for designated lighting products. The programs must provide a province-wide, no-charge collection and recycling system for designated products at end-of-life. Obligated sellers of designated products must operate or be members of an approved program.

Product Care Association (PCA) operates approved programs in each of the regulated jurisdictions. The PCA programs are open to all obligated sellers to join as members. Program members fund the programs by environmental handling fees ("eco-fees") paid to the program based on the number of units sold in the provinces where there is a program. The fee rates vary by province, product type and size.

British Columbia

PCA's BC LightRecycle program began July 1, 2010 and was initially limited to residential-use mercury-containing lamps. The BC Recycling Regulation now designates all lighting products including lamps, ballasts and fixtures, whether supplied for residential or for industrial, commercial, and institutional (ICI) use, and all of these products are included in the expanded BC LightRecycle program. Member eco-fee obligations for the new BC product categories will commence on October 1, 2012.

Manitoba

PCA's MB LightRecycle program launched on May 1, 2012 as part of PCA's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) program, which includes many other products. The MB LightRecycle program is limited to residential-use fluorescent lamps.

Quebec

In Quebec, the program name is "RecycFluo" and PCA operates under the name Association des Producteurs Responsables (APR). The Quebec <u>Regulation respecting the recovery and reclamation of products by enterprises</u> obligates all "brand owners/first suppliers" of mercury-containing lamps to either operate or be a member of an approved program to recover and reclaim end-of-life mercury-containing lamps in Quebec. PCA/APR's RecycFluo program is the only authorized product stewardship program in Quebec for mercury-containing lamps.

The program has been funded by "eco-fees" applied to the sale of mercury-containing lamps sold separately in QC since October 1, 2012, including sales to the residential, industrial, commercial and institutional sectors. Effective October 1, 2013, fees will also apply to component mercury-containing lamps sold integrated into lighting fixtures and automobiles. Quebec law limits the use of visible fees.

Upcoming Federal Legislation

The Federal government has begun the process of mandating product stewardship programs for mercury-containing lamps in all Canadian provinces with a current target date of 2014. It is expected that existing provincial regulations will continue, so long as they "meet or exceed" the federal requirements.
