Outdoor Power Equipment: BC, contracted by OPEIC






COLLECTION NETWORK

PCA PSF ISP Program



- As of April 1, 2016 PCA assumed the end-of-life management for PSF including collection, transportation and processing
- Program was developed with the support from industry partners and the Canadian Consumer and Specialty Product Association (CCSPA)
- Enables PSF stewards to meet their obligations under the Waste Diversion Act.



PCA PSF ISP Program



- Offers industry management and cost predictability with fixed unit based fee rates (EHFs)
- PCA is currently working with municipalities and service providers to improve program performance and efficiency



Ont Program Launch ()((()(())(())(()))



- Product Care's (PCA's) ON Pesticides, Solvent and Fertilizer (PSF) program launched April 1, 2016
- Thank you to all of our members for making this program possible
- Number of registered PSF stewards significantly exceeded the number of stewards who signed letters of intent

PSF Definitions ISP Program



Pesticides

Means pesticides including fungicides, herbicides and insecticides registered under the Pest Control Products Act (Canada) bearing the "DOMESTIC" classification that are required to display on the label the symbol shown in Schedule III of the Pest Control Products Regulation (Canada), the signal words "danger" or "warning" and "poison" and represented by the precautionary symbols octagon or diamond and the skull and crossbones.Offers industry management and cost predictability with fixed unit based fee rates (EHFs)



PSF Definitions ISP Program



Solvents

Means liquid products that are intended to be used to dissolve or thin a compatible substance and:

1. Are comprised of 10% or more of water-immiscible liquid hydrocarbons, including halogen-substituted liquid hydrocarbons; or

2. Are flammable as described in part (c) of "municipal hazardous waste" in Ontario Reg. 542; or

3. All of the above.



PSF Definitions ISP Program



• Fertilizers

Means packaged products regulated under the Fertilizers Act (Canada).

PSF ISP EHF Rates ()(()(())



- PCA refers to its fees as "Environmental Handling Fees" or EHFs
- We encourage all members of the program to use this terminology when describing PCA's funding model to your stakeholders

Product Category	Reporting Unit	PCA ON PSF EHF Rates	
Pesticides	KG or Litre	\$ 1.08	
Solvents Litre		\$ 0.33	
Fertilizers	KG or Litre	\$ 0.07	



PSF ISP EHF Rates ()((())(())



- EHF rates are applied per unit of product sold/supplied in each product category in Ontario
- EHF rates were derived from a multi-year budget approved by PCA's Board of Directors with input from stewards
- At least 90 days notice will be given to members of any rate increase or decrease if required



VISIBILITY OF FEES



- Visibility of fees varies by province:
 - BC, SK, MB and NS: May show fee separately
 - NL, NB, PEI and ON: Fee cannot be visible







- As a member of the ON PSF ISP you are required to have "no visible fees" displayed to the end-user of paints and coatings products
- Companies are allowed to display EHFs in business to business transactions provided the business is not the enduser





Visible Fees



- During the member registration process, ON PSF members accepted the Supplementary Letter of Agreement for the Ontario PSF ISP which includes the "no visible fee" requirement
- This requirement is meant to reduce consumer confusion which occurred in the past
- EHF rates are expected to be incorporated into the price of the PSF products to the end-user in the same way as other costs (eg. manufacturing, transportation, retail operation, etc.)
- This requirement does not mean that EHF rates are a secret, in fact, EHF rates are publicly available on our website



Reporting to PCA $(\mathbb{P})(\mathbb{P})(\mathbb{P})$




- PCA's PSF ISP members begin reporting to Product Care as of June, 2016 for May 2016 PSF sales
- Reports and fee remittance are due within 30 days of a calendar month end
- Fee reports and remittances are required monthly, except for qualifying "small remitters"
- Once a monthly report is submitted, an invoice is automatically generated based on the EHF rates plus HST



Product Care ISPs	Paint	75.9 % of depot hourly rate	Service providers paid an incentive rate/kg (except paint aerosols)	ISP pays muni specified \$/tonne by region
	PS&F and paint aerosols	Pest: 0.3%, Solv: 5.3%, Fert: 0.2% of depot hourly rate	PCA reimburses muni for % share of actual costs	
SO IFO	Other phase 1 products	18.3% of depot hourly rate	SO pays service providers by incentive system	SO pays - same as above



Ontario Paint Program

- Municipalities pack same waste class eg. aerosols, obligated and non-obligated, into the same "commingled" drum (lab pack)
- lab pack studies are conducted seasonally each year
- Lab pack factors are used to allocate cost (and kg's) of PSF between PCA and the munis
- PCA now conducting lab pack studies
