Product Care Association (PCA) BC LightRecycle Program: Supplier - Customer Remitter Determination Form

Program Background:

The British Columbia Recycling Regulation requires the "producers" (typically brandowners or first importers, including retailers, distributors and manufacturers) of all lamps, ballasts and fixtures sold or supplied into the residential, commercial and industrial sectors in BC to be part of an approved stewardship program. The Product Care Association ("PCA") BC LightRecycle program began in 2010 for residential-use fluorescent lamps. This program expands on October 1, 2012 to include all lamps, ballasts and fixtures sold into the residential, commercial and industrial sectors in BC. The program will be funded by the payment to PCA by members of "eco-fees" applied to the quantity new lamps (all lamp types, sales to all sectors), ballasts and fixtures supplied or sold in BC, effective October 1, 2012. Members of the program must report their sales and remit applicable eco-fees to PCA on a monthly basis.

Purpose of this Document:

- a) In some circumstances it is more convenient for an organization that is not the obligated party under the applicable regulation to become a member of PCA and to report and remit the fees payable to PCA.
- b) The Supplier and the Customer wish to record their agreement in this regard.

Remitter Options:

The Customer(s) of the Supplier has the choice of:

- Supplier Remits: Having the Supplier fulfill the responsibility of reporting sales/remitting fees on their behalf. If the Supplier remits fees to PCA on with respect to sales to a Customer, the cost of the fees may be included in product invoices after October 1, 2012.
- **Customer Remits:** Joining PCA as a member to report their sales/remit fees to the program directly.

As the seller of obligated products in BC, the Supplier (see below for company information) has registered as a member of PCA for the BC LightRecycle program. The Customer of the Supplier may choose to join Product Care directly to report their sales/remit fees or have the Supplier fulfill this responsibility on their behalf. If the Supplier remits fees to Product Care on behalf of a Customer, the cost of the fees may be included in product invoices after October 1, 2012.

The following Supplier-Customer Remitter Determination Form is provided as a template to determine which party will fulfill the responsibility to report sales and remit fees to PCA for the BC LightRecycle program. A copy of this document should be sent to PCA once signed by both parties.

In order to NOT be invoiced the cost of the fees remitted to PCA after October 1, 2012, the Supplier
requires proof that the Customer has become a member of PCA by completing this form (including their
PCA member registration number) by[Date]

If a company does not respond to this letter, the "Supplier Remits" option will be assumed.

cost of the eco-fees on invoices rendered to the Customer with respect to the obligated products.

The Supplier agrees that such reports and remittances are the Supplier's responsibility. In order to remit the eco-fees, the Supplier acknowledges that the Supplier is registered as a PCA member (see registration number above).
