1. GLOSSARY OF TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

This glossary defines key terms used in this guide to help members determine whether their products are included and how to report them correctly. Definitions are aligned with applicable jurisdictional regulations where relevant.

Term	Definition
EHFs	Environmental handling fees.
EPR	Extended producer responsibility. A regulatory framework under which obligated parties (as defined in each jurisdiction) are responsible for the end-of-life management of designated products.
IC&I	Institutional, Commercial, and Industrial
Products Containing Mercury Regulations (“PCM Regulations”)	Recent amendments to the Canadian mercury-containing products regulations introduce additional restrictions and phase-outs for certain mercury lamps. Members should ensure they remain informed of these requirements. See: Mercury-Containing Products Regulations (SOR/2014-254)
Obligated Party	The obligated party responsible for meeting EPR obligations for designated products, which may include a brand owner, manufacturer, distributor, supplier, importer, retailer, franchisor, or marketplace facilitator, etc., as defined by jurisdiction-specific regulations.
Product Care	Product Care Association of Canada
Product Care Member	An organization, business, or individual that has registered with Product Care and participates in at least one program, which may include producers, retailers, brand owners, distributors, or other entities, regardless of whether they are the obligated party in a jurisdiction.
Regulations/Regulatory framework	Jurisdiction-specific EPR, recycling, and product stewardship regulations that determine which products are designated, who is obligated, and how products must be managed.
Stewardship plan	An EPR or program stewardship plan submitted to, and approved by, the applicable regulatory authority that describes how regulatory obligations for designated products will be met.

2. ABOUT PRODUCT CARE

Product Care Association of Canada (“Product Care”) is a federally incorporated, not-for-profit product stewardship association formed in response to extended producer responsibility (“EPR”) regulations and is governed by a multi-sector industry board of directors. Product Care currently manages lighting stewardship programs in seven jurisdictions: British Columbia, Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island.

This product guide (“this guide”) applies only to lamps and lighting equipment managed under Product Care’s Lights programs. Product Care also operates stewardship programs for Paint products, Household Hazardous Wastes, Hazardous and Special Products, and Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarms in various jurisdictions on behalf of its industry members. Product Care is funded by its industry members who produce or sell obligated products that are regulated under the EPR model. Environmental Handling Fees (“EHFs”) that are collected by Product Care from members are used to cover program costs, including managing the collection, transportation, and processing systems for obligated products. The take-back or collection systems in each jurisdiction are free for the public to use to recycle and safely dispose obligated products at their end-of-life.

Product Care is not a regulator or government body. Regulatory authority rests with the applicable provincial ministry or delegated authority where applicable.

3. PURPOSE OF THIS GUIDE

This guide provides members with direction on:

- Whether a lighting product is included or excluded in each jurisdiction
- Which product subcategory applies
- How products must be reported
- How Environmental Handling Fees (EHFs) are applied

This guide is designed to support accurate product classification and reporting under Product Care’s Lights programs across Canada.

This document does not replace provincial legislation or provide legal interpretation. Where uncertainty exists, members should consult the applicable regulation or seek legal advice.

This guide is not intended to address restrictions that may apply under the Products Containing Mercury Regulations (“PCM Regulations”). It is the responsibility of each company to ensure that the supply and sale of mercury-containing lamps comply with applicable federal and provincial regulations. Recent amendments to the Canadian PCM Regulations introduce restrictions and the phase-out for certain mercury lamps. Members should ensure they remain informed of these requirements. 6.5. LIGHTING EMITTING DIODES (LEDS)

Light Emitting Diode (LED) lamps—including bulbs, emitters, modules, and tubes—are reported differently depending on the jurisdiction. In British Columbia (BC), all LED lamps are reported under a single product subcategory. In other jurisdictions, LED lamps are divided into two separate subcategories based on product type. See applicable LED product subcategories and their jurisdictional application below.

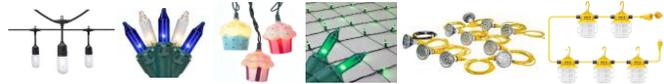

6.11. FIXTURES

Description:

These subcategories only apply in BC.

- Includes electronic or electrical equipment designed to house and operate one or more lamps with a primary purpose that is to illuminate or assist in the illumination of space. Fixtures may contain removeable/replaceable lamps or integrated (non-removeable) light sources.
- Includes fixtures supplied across the following sectors: Residential, Institutional, and Commercial.

Important note:

- Stand-alone lamp holders, replacement heads for track lights and egress lighting, and housing for recessed lights are considered included products.
- It is the responsibility of each company to ensure that the supply and sale of mercury-containing lamps comply with applicable federal and provincial regulations. See: [Products Containing Mercury Regulations \(SOR/2014-254\)](#).

Exclusions:

- Products whose primary purpose is not illumination (e.g., signaling, display, decorative-only effects, or non-lighting functions with incidental lighting) are not classified as fixtures and are not included.
- Parts and accessories designed to be integrated into a complete fixture are not charged an EHF. See below for examples:
 - Table lamp sockets and replacement shades.
 - Trim for recessed lights sold separately from housing.
 - Lighting tracks without heads attached (Note: If heads are attached, product is classified as “fixed track” within Fixture Category A subcategory, heads sold separately are captured under Designated Small Fixtures subcategory.)
 - Lamp-holders for linear fixtures that are not standalone and must be integrated into a linear fixture.
 - Exit signs without attached light heads.
 - Light switches and controls (such as dimmers and timers).
 - Replacement cords.
 - Lighting posts sold separately from post top fixtures.

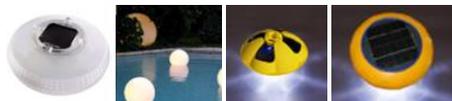

7. ENVIRONMENTAL HANDLING FEES-RELATED INFORMATION

EHFs are remitted by Product Care members based on their unit sales in the jurisdiction where Product Care has programs.

EHFs are taxable, as they are considered to be part of the price of products. While the taxes are remitted to the government, no part of the fee itself is remitted to the government.

Jurisdictional regulations determine whether EHFs can be displayed as a separate line item on an invoice or receipt. For more information, please refer to the regulations listed in Table 14.
